ROLE DESCRIPTION

The trainee will be a member of our Nature Reserves team and will assist in the practical day-to-day management of our 19 nature reserves. This includes tasks like habitat management, hedge and grass cutting, path maintenance and invasive species removal. As well as practical nature conservation tasks and survey work, the trainee will also assist with public and community engagement events and activities at our nature reserves. They will receive on the job and course-based training opportunities in practical conservation tasks and the use of nature reserve management tools and machinery. They will be supervised by experienced core staff within our Nature Reserves team. Depending on their interests and career aspirations, trainees will have the option to spend some time with other staff teams within Ulster Wildlife. They will take part in full organisation staff development days and have the opportunity if they wish to join and play an active role within the Ulster Wildlife Youth Forum, thereby accessing many further developmental opportunities.

SUPPORT AND TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

This placement is part of a national programme - New to Nature - funded by the National Lottery Heritage Fund. This will include additional elements of training and personal development support provided by Groundwork UK and partners, as well as on the job training and support from Ulster Wildlife.

Each trainee will complete an in-depth induction programme with input from New to Nature partners, along with tailored advice and guidance from a Groundwork Employment Coach at key points during the placement. This may include identifying skills and training opportunities or help with your CV and job search skills.

Ulster Wildlife will also be providing support for participants, including: first aid, health & safety and risk assessments, brushcutters and strimmers, woodchipper, species monitoring and ID.

All New to Nature trainees will be invited to participate in a learning Network. This will create opportunities to take part in different talks, workshops and discussions focused on the environment sector, hosted by Groundwork and our partners.
