Ulster Wildlife is Northern Ireland's largest local nature conservation charity. Since 1978, we've been working to **bring nature back** on land and at sea, inspire people to take action, and play our part in tackling the climate and ecological emergencies.

- We safeguard species at risk, including barn owls, hedgehogs, and red squirrels.

What You'll Do

As a Membership Fundraiser, you'll be out and about across Northern Ireland, inspiring people to join Ulster Wildlife and support our vital conservation work.

Your days will include:

- Travelling to exciting venues such as garden centres, shopping centres, farm shops, festivals and community events.
- Setting up an eye-catching stand and making sure it looks welcoming.
- Engaging with the public listening, chatting, and sharing why nature needs our help.
- Inspire people to become members, supporting Ulster Wildlife with regular donations.
- Recording new memberships accurately and responsibly.
- Acting as an ambassador for Ulster Wildlife, always leaving a positive impression.

Every conversation you have is a chance to make a difference!

What You'll Get

We value the people who represent us. In return for your energy and commitment, we offer:

- Salary: £24,023 per year (pro rata for part-time roles) plus commission
- Pension: Employer contribution of up to 10% per annum.
- Holidays: 24 days annual leave + 12 statutory days (rising with service), pro rata for part-time roles
- Flexi-time: Support for a healthy work-life balance.
- Health cash-back plan to help with everyday wellbeing.
- Mileage (0.45p per mile) & expenses covered within agreed parameters.

A Day in the Life

No two days are ever quite the same, but here's what a typical day could look like:

- Morning: Pack your stand and materials into the car, head to a busy garden centre. Set up your stand with banners, leaflets and a smile.
- Midday: Engage with families and shoppers share stories of hedgehogs, barn owls, and peatland restoration. Celebrate when someone signs up as a new member!
- Afternoon: Keep the energy up resilience is key. You'll get a mix of yes and no, but every conversation matters.
- Evening: Pack up, head home, do some quick admin and celebrate your day with your team.

Some days you might be at a big event like The Balmoral Show, other days a quiet pet shop – variety is part of the fun.









What We're Looking For

You don't need to be a wildlife expert – what matters most is your passion for people and your confidence to make a difference.

We're looking for people who are:

- Confident communicators who enjoy talking to new people.
- Resilient and positive even when facing rejection.
- Motivated and self-reliant comfortable working solo as well as part of a team.
- Flexible about working most weekends, evenings, and public holidays.
- **Practical and organised** able to set up stands and manage equipment and plan your day.
- Drivers with access to a car for travelling to venues across NI.

It helps if you have knowledge of Gift Aid, data protection, or fundraising practice. But don't worry if you don't—if you have the passion and people skills, we'll support you with training.

Training and Support

From the moment you join, you'll get the tools and encouragement you need to succeed:

- Induction training at our Belfast office, plus organisation-wide introductions so you understand our work and mission.
- On-the-job shadowing with experienced fundraisers.
- Mentored shifts to build your confidence.
- Regular 1-to-1s and team meetings with your Team Leader.
- Ongoing training in fundraising best practice, health & safety, and personal development.

We're here to support you – you'll never feel like you're on your own.



FAOs

Do I need to know a lot about wildlife?

Not at all! We'll give you all the training you need. What matters most is your enthusiasm for people and your willingness to learn.

Will I be working on my own?

Yes, many shifts are solo, but you'll always be part of the Membership Team. You'll have regular check-ins and longer 1-to-1s, and lots of opportunities to work alongside colleagues at larger events.

What sort of venues will I be in?

Everything from busy shopping centres and garden centres to local festivals and major shows. Variety is guaranteed!

What happens if the weather is bad?

Outdoor events go ahead in all reasonable conditions – but don't worry, you'll be provided with suitable uniform and support.

Will I need to provide my own equipment?

No – we'll provide you with a portable stand, banners, leaflets, and other materials. You'll just need a car to transport them.

Can this role lead to other opportunities?

Absolutely! The skills you'll build – communication, resilience, and people engagement – are highly transferable and valued across many sectors.









ROLE DESCRIPTION

Role:	Face to Face Membership Fundraiser (regular giving)
Salary:	£24,023 (pro rata for part time roles) plus Commission. Access to employer's contributory pension scheme - maximum 10% per annum (Pending Pay Award Approval from April 2025)
Contract:	Permanent. This post is subject to a 6-month probationary period.
Hours:	Full-time (37.5hrs pw), part-time (15hrs, 22.5hrs, 30hrs) and casual will be considered. Weekend and Public Holiday work will be frequent with occasional evening work.
Location:	Northern Ireland wide. You will be required to travel to venues and events throughout NI; You will be required to attend meetings and training at Ulster Wildlife Offices, 10 Heron Road, Belfast, BT3 9LE and occasionally at other Ulster Wildlife sites.
Leave:	24 days per annum plus 12 days statutory holidays rising to 26 days following three years' service. (Pro-rata for part time roles)
Reporting to:	Membership Team Leader
Other Benefits:	 Health cash-back plan Flexi-time system Mileage (0.45p pm) and expenses (within agreed parameters).

KEY DUTIES OF THE POST

- Achieve individual targets for signing up new members (monthly donors) by proactively engaging with the public at fundraising venues.
- Understand the principals of Gift Aid and encourage new members to sign up to the Gift Aid scheme.
- Develop and maintain an understanding of the work of Ulster Wildlife, its activities and nature reserves to persuade new members to support Ulster Wildlife.
- Accurately record and submit new members' information always complying with our Data Protection Policy and Procedures.
- Ensure all membership fundraising activities are carried out in accordance with the Code of Fundraising Practice and other best practice promoted by the Fundraising Regulator, the Institute of Fundraising and Ulster Wildlife policies.
- Maintain and bolster the development of positive relationships with pre-existing fundraising venue managers and staff.
- Provide feedback to the Membership Team Leader on locations and events to maximize future membership promotion opportunities.
- Work with the Membership Team Leader on the research and booking of venues and events for membership fundraising opportunities.
- Work with the Membership Team Leader to develop and deliver nature and wildlife themed talks for groups / organisations with the view to increasing the scope of membership fundraising opportunities.
- Maintain and be responsible for Ulster Wildlife equipment and promotional materials.



• Attend any training/team meeting/events organised by Ulster Wildlife as well as monthly/annual supervision meetings.

No job description can cover every issue which may arise and subsequently the postholder may be expected to carry out other duties broadly consistent with those itemised above.

PERSON SPECIFICATION

Who is this role for?

This role suits someone who has strong communication skills, is a team player, self-motivated and determined to succeed in the role along with an understanding of Ulster Wildlife's need for regular giving donors.

We welcome applications from people living across Northern Ireland as we wish to cover as wide a range of venues and events as reasonably practical. There is no requirement to live within close distance to our Head Office in Belfast.

Essential Criteria

- 1. At least one year's full-time (or part-time equivalent) experience in a face-to-face sales, promotions or fundraising role. This may be from paid employment or voluntary experience.
- 2. Demonstrate experience in successfully meeting agreed sales or fundraising targets.
- 3. The confidence and capability to approach and build rapport with members of the public, and inspire verbally, asking for financial support from potential new members
- 4. The ability to work alone and solve problems without direct daily supervision.
- 5. The ability to undertake basic administrative tasks, keeping accurate records and submitting paperwork on time.
- 6. Basic IT skills including use of a combined email and calendar service e.g., MS Outlook or Gmail.
- 7. Full driving licence and access to your own transport for business purposes which enables you to meet the requirements of the post in full.
- 8. Minimum of a Grade C or equivalent Level 2 qualification in English Language and Mathematics.
- 9. Flexibility to work most weekends and some evenings.
- 10. The ability to transport bulky and heavy items such as gazebo and associated weights, display stands and boxes of information (up to 30kg). Where possible you will be provided with a carry case and a trolley to transport equipment.

Desirable Criteria

- 1. Experience of securing donors for a voluntary/community organisation.
- 2. Knowledge of the Code of Fundraising Practice and Data Protection principles.



How to Apply

Applying is simple:

- 1. Download the application form from www.ulsterwildlife.org/jobs.
- 2. Complete the application and monitoring form (Microsoft Word format only, no PDFs please).

We anticipate interviews to take place on 22nd October and Trial Shifts week beginning 27th October.

CVs aren't accepted, but don't worry – your application form is your chance to shine. Use examples to show us how your skills and experience match the role.

What Happens Next

We'll keep you updated at every stage. Here's what to expect:

- Stage 1: Interview
 A friendly, question-based interview at our Belfast office (approx. 30 minutes).
- Stage 2: Trial Shift
 Spend around 2.5 hours with an experienced fundraiser at a local venue. This is your chance to see the role in action and show us your potential.

We aim to let candidates know the outcome of their application within two weeks. If you have any questions at any stage, just get in touch – we're here to help.
