

Priority Species Student Placement Opportunity 2026/27

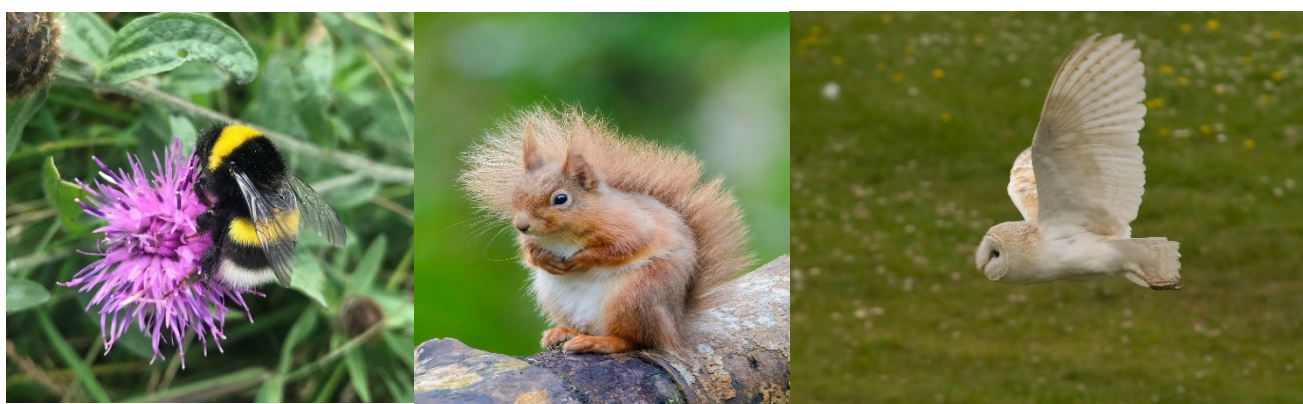

Background

Ulster Wildlife is a local nature conservation charity working to protect habitats and species for future generations here in Northern Ireland. Ulster Wildlife works for nature, people and climate. We have been part of species conservation in Northern Ireland for over 40 years and we continue to work to support local habitats and species. We have been successfully working on barn owl and red squirrel conservation, as well as a host of other species. We are expanding our work with a new 'Let Nature In' wildlife gardening campaign, including hedgehogs, and this opportunity provides you with the chance to be involved in all aspects of our work.



Purpose of role:

The role of the placement student will be to assist with the Let Nature In campaign. You will assist with raising awareness of the importance of gardens for nature's recovery and help the Let Nature In Officer with the delivery of the project and subsequent training. Throughout the year you will also assist the Senior Conservation Officer and Priority Species Officer with various aspects of the species projects including work on red squirrels, pine martens, barn owls and hedgehogs. This could include survey work, processing data, putting up nest boxes, pellet dissection, attending farm visits, helping at events, creating content, and producing materials.

Main responsibilities:

- Assist with the development and delivery of a series of talks for individuals and Ulster Wildlife members on taking action for nature in gardens and green spaces.
- Help develop bespoke learning materials in key wildlife-friendly gardening subjects.
- Help with the delivery of training, both online and in-person, in wildlife-friendly gardening topics to key stakeholder groups, for example, housing developers or community groups.
- Help collection of sightings of hedgehog, and promotion of hedgehog-friendly gardening annually through Let Nature In and the Irish Hedgehog Survey.
- Carry out fieldwork for the species projects.
- Carry out data analysis for the species projects.
- Carry out pellet dissection to contribute to a wider study of barn owl diet.
- Assist with the 2026 Barn Owl Survey.
- Help with barn owl and red squirrel events.
- Promote Ulster Wildlife and our species work.



Skills required:

- Undertaking an Environmental Sciences/Ecology/Zoology BSc degree or similar.
- Passionate about nature conservation.
- Excellent written and oral communication skills.
- IT skills – competent in MS Office; particularly Word and Excel.
- Excellent team worker.
- Motivated and able to work without supervision.
- Well organised and competent with time management.
- Willingness to learn.
- Able to work occasional evenings or weekends.
- Use of a car/driving licence.

Desirable skills:

- Confident in/experience with GIS.
- Volunteering experience.
- Experience of carrying out species surveys.

We do not require practical conservation skills; we are happy to teach these and provide training qualifications. However, we do require the student to have a willingness to learn and is proactive about their own self development.
